After more than a year the **Women's Voices** interfaith discussion group will hold its first "in-person" regular monthly gathering on **Thursday, August 5**th from 12:30 PM to 2:30 PM. We invite women of all faiths (or women with no faith community) who want to engage in respectful discussion about spiritual issues with their neighbors to join us. For the start of 2021 we will gather in the Oasis Room at **Northwoods Presbyterian Church**, 3320 Cypress Creek Pkwy (FM 1960), at the intersection with T.C. Jester, Houston TX 77068.

The group selected <u>Embracing Uncertainty: Breakthrough Methods for Achieving</u> <u>Peace of Mind When Facing the Unknown</u> by Susan Jeffers to use as our discussion guide. The book has been described as powerful, life-affirming and healing, and we hope it will give us some good guidance as we move out of the pandemic into an uncertain future. For this first session, we ask everyone to read the Introduction and Chapters 1 and 2. It is available from Amazon in paperback (new and used) and in Kindle format.

For this first meeting only, the group is invited to come early at 12:00pm, and shop in the World Store just outside the Oasis Room. 

Cypress Creek Christian Church will present a 9/11 program to reflect on the tragic events of twenty years ago.

Presenters will include:

Dr. Khawaja Azimuddin from the Islamic Art Society and other local artists will discuss their work and how interfaith relations have shaped and influenced them.

Saadia Faruqi, the author of the book, "Yusuf Azeem is Not a Hero", will share the theme of her book which is about a young man who personally experiences the aftermath of 9/11 in how he is treated by others.

Cypress Creek Christian Church will reflect on how our society has changed and what we have learned as a result of those events twenty years ago.

The Barbara Bush Library will have a display of books written on the subject and available at the event. These books may be checked out at the event using the library's mobile app.

The Pearl Fincher Museum will also have an event at their facility next door to the Church.






